McLean, Virginia — Senator Jeff Flake (R-AZ) made an impassioned call to vote “yes” and vote “no” Tuesday to move forward on the United States Supreme Court nominee, Judge Brett Kavanaugh. In an extraordinary turnabout from his statements last week, Flake was the lone “no” vote. Flake made the announcement in a speech on the Senate floor, where he discussed Justice Anthony Kennedy’s retirement from the court and asked that the consideration of Kavanaugh’s nomination “be delayed until after the midterm elections.” Senator Flake called Kavanaugh’s nomination to the Supreme Court “the process for the normal” and insisted that senators not be “bullied by threats or pressure to vote a certain way.” He also alleged that Senate Democrats were “trying to destroy a good man.” And in his 15-minute speech on the floor Tuesday morning, Flake said that he had “reservations” about Kavanaugh’s views. “My reservations about Judge Kavanaugh are centered on the issues regarding the presumption of innocence, fairness in criminal law, the proper functioning of the trial, and the importance of hearing both sides. I want to make clear that I do not make this decision lightly, but after much consideration, I believe that the committee should delay its vote on Judge Kavanaugh and I will be voting no to confirm Judge Kavanaugh,” he said. Flake said that he did not believe Kavanaugh’s nomination would ensure the Senate’s “filibuster-proof majority” or “defeat a Democratic president in 2020.” Flake said he was “alarmed” by recent conduct of certain of the “dramatic left” who showed up at the hearing last week. He said Democrats have “attacked the judge as a drunken teenager.” “This is not an allegation we can settle here today. It is a serial liar’s tale,” he said. Flake said Republicans and conservatives have been vilified in the press. “The extremes on the right are calling for destruction of the high court,”
